ABOUT

Patriot is the sans-serif version of Exocet, one of our most popular typefaces released through Emigre. Patriot, like Exocet, is based upon early Greek and Roman stone-carving, yet it adheres more closely to the shared historical source material. Patriot was developed to include unique forms and alternative characters, becoming a striking original typeface in its own right.

Patriot is named after the surface-to-air missile system manufactured by Raytheon and used by the United States Army and several allied nations. The name Patriot also refers to a kind of jingoistic nationalism, the blind support and defence of a nation-state against enemies or detractors. The name reveals the potentiality of language—the capacity to create peace or to incite violence.
